Shortly after sending off their Christmas cards the students of Gloria Fuertes de Jaén received Christmas cards too!!





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## John Lennon

John Lennon is the author of this week's reflection. He was born in Liverpool, England in 1940. He was the leader of the British rock group the Beatles. He was a song writer for their group and later was a peace activist.

We chose this quote for peace day as it explains perfectly well that peace can only be achieved without violence. Where there is violence there is no peace and where there is peace there is no violence.

As a peace activist, John fought extremely hard for what he believed in. He believed that we should be able to live in a world where we don't have to worry, where we can be at peace.


